Training Workshop for IBSE Master Trainers on Climate Change Education 27-30 August 2018, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia

Background:

There are currently about 60 science educators in the Asia - Pacific Region who have received two weeks of training in IBSE over two years organised by the International Science, Technology and Innovation Centre for South-South Cooperation under the auspices of UNESCO (ISTIC) and conducted by La main a la Pate facilitators. After attending the programme they are expected to play a major role in disseminating inquiry-based science education (IBSE) to colleagues and other teachers in their home countries and organisations. In Malaysia and probably elsewhere, IBSE is gaining momentum, hence there is growing demand for the services of the IBSE workshop participants as trainers. For example, three former participants of ISTIC's IBSE workshops have conducted training workshops in Sudan. The Academy of Sciences Malaysia has from time to time requested the services of the workshop participants in training teachers involved in their IBSE projects. However, the contents of the IBSE training workshops attended by these trainers focused more on the conduct of IBSE and not on preparing them to be trainers.

Rationale:

Good master trainers can effectively deliver a subject. There is a need to develop a cadre of competent master trainers in IBSE who are experts at delivery. They need to be properly prepared for the role of trainers as quality training can be a motivating experience to the participants. Such training can instill confidence and guide participants to be effective in their work. It is proposed that a training workshop for IBSE master trainers be organised for the Asia and Pacific Region.

Objectives of Workshop

1. To sensitise trainers on issues of climate change using IBSE as an approach to teaching climate change education
2. To enhance skills, understanding and competency of master trainers to assist teachers in implementing the approach; and
3. To provide the master trainers a solid framework for delivering training.

Who can attend?

Participants will comprise 40 science educators. They must have attended at least one IBSE workshop organised by ISTIC.

Workshop Content:

The workshop has two parts. The first part will cover topics on climate change education through IBSE. The United Nations have declared climate change is one of the major challenges of our time. In that context, teachers require educational resources as well as professional development to be able to offer climate change education to their pupils. IBSE has been widely recognised as an effective approach to teaching science and has been given priority by IAP SEP in its efforts at improving science education. This in turn would hopefully be able to highlight the pressing issue of climate change to the larger audience.

The second part of the workshop would expose participants to IBSE concepts of Training of Trainers (ToT), including essential skills in delivering training on IBSE, to be effective IBSE teachers and creating a conducive environment for IBSE teaching and learning.

This capacity building workshop will enable them to understand better on methodologies and enhance their skills, knowledge and competency, apply current facilitative skill that will promote learner engagement, show mastery in delivering key training strategies such as brainstorming and practice sessions.

Mode of Delivery:

The workshop will have a mixed approach which includes lectures, analysis of case studies, practical sessions and a field visit.

Expected Outcome

The workshop is expected to produce a cadre of 40 trainers who can effectively deliver training programmes on science-based topics using IBSE.

Facilitators

The workshop facilitators will be from Malaysia, La main a la Pate Foundation (Office for Climate Education).

Partners

ISTIC as main organizer will prepare workshop brochure in consultation with La main a la Pate Foundation, announce the workshop on its website and contact embassies for the same purpose, process applications, shortlist applications, send out invitation letters to successful participants, organization and management of workshop (selection of workshop venue, accommodation, airport transfer, payments, day-to-day running of workshop, recording) workshop evaluation and preparation of workshop report. It will prepare the programmes schedule, list the materials and resources required and conduct the programme.

La main a la Pate Foundation (LAMAP) will be the main partner. It will provide advice and expertise on the programme and facilitate the programme on specific topics such as climate change education.

Created in 2018, the **Office for Climate Education (OCE)** as part of LAMAP aims to organise a strong international scientific, educational and operational cooperation for Climate Change education. These teaching resources will be free, interdisciplinary, adapted to local needs, widely spread, translated in many languages and will facilitate an active pedagogy. Based in Paris, *the Office for Climate Education* will work with a global network of local or regional partners in over

40 countries already, including the *InterAcademy Partnership for Science* – a global federation of Science Academies.

The InterAcademy Partnership (IAP) was formally launched in South Africa in March 2016, bringing together three established networks of academies of science, medicine and engineering, namely IAP, the global network of science academies, the InterAcademy Medical Panel (IAMP) and the InterAcademy Council (IAC).

Under the new InterAcademy Partnership, more than 130 national and regional member academies work together to support the special role of science and its efforts to seek solutions to address the world's most challenging problems. In particular, IAP harnesses the expertise of the world's scientific, medical and engineering leaders to advance sound policies, improve public health, promote excellence in science education, and achieve other critical development goals.
